

Instructions for Feeding:

The most common use of the Petpost Coconut Oil for Dogs is to use it as a supplement and add it to their diet. When treating Mr. Snuggles, you need to move forward slowly, because adding too much coconut oil to your dog's diet at once can make them a bit sick to the stomach. If you've given old Pumpernickel too much you will know by the diarrhea or greasy stools that will inevitably follow.

- Start with 1/4 teaspoon per day for small dogs or puppies under 2 years old.
- Start with 1 teaspoon per day for large dogs.
- After a few weeks of this initial small dosage, you can gradually begin adding more. As a general rule, the optimal dose of coconut oil for your dog is about 1 teaspoon per 10 pounds of body weight.
- The best part about the Petpost Coconut Oil for Dogs is that Maximus is going to love the stuff. You can add dry or liquid spoonfuls directly to your dog's food.
- If you begin to notice any diarrhea or unusual bowel movements, stop the treatment immediately and go back to the lower amount. This is not cause for any serious concern, but you are using too much coconut oil for your.





Instructions for Topical Use:

- In addition to all of the problem areas, go ahead and rub your hands through the outer layers of your dogs fur and belly for nice even coverage.
